reece is a country of immense interests, diverse cultures, and tremendous history. The people, literature, art, architecture, politics, music, traditions, language, beliefs, food, and customs- the history of all these aspects of Greece at once dominated the known world, and to this day still fascinate the imagination. The people of Greece speak of their country with intense passion, born from a great pride in this history.

Music is an integral part of Greek culture, and is as rich in diversity as its history. Greek music may best be broadly categorized by its traditional folk music, and by the music of the Byz-

antine period. Derived from ancient times, traditional Greek music is highly expressive and melodious, and in many ways originated as accompaniment to Greek theater. Greek music from Byzantine times was associated with the sacred chants of Christianity, and is distinguished by its modality.

The American Celebration of Music is a special annual performance-tour program, co-sponsored by local governments, music associations, community organizations, and tourist boards around the globe. In many countries this has developed into a prestigious, recognized, year-long concert-series festival. Recognition of this festival facilitates greater access to performance venues, official publicity, generally very successful

concert arrangements, and the ability to touch local cultures in a way that may not be done through other affiliations. This equates to more meaningful musical and emotional experiences for participating performance ensembles.

ATHENS / ARGOLIS REGION / HYDRA POROS / AEGINA

DAY ONE: ARRIVE

Depart via scheduled air service. The destination is Athens, Greece

DAY TWO: ATHENS

Arrive in Athens

Meet your MCI Tour Manager, who will assist the group to awaiting chartered motorcoach for a transfer to the hotel via orientation tour of Athens' highlights en route, including Constitution Square and Kendriki Agora (Central Market)

DAY THREE: ATHENS

Participate in a tour of Athens, including a visit to the Acropolis (Parthenon). DAY FOUR: ATHENS / ARGOLIS REGION

Full-day tour of the Argolis region

Visit Corinth where you can see the famous Corinth Canal

Continue to Epidaurus. The most famous site here is the theatre, the most outstanding in the ancient world, known for its beauty, its magnificent lines, harmonious proportions and incredible acoustics

For choirs only: Impromptu recital in the theatre

Then it is off to visit the ancient city of Mycenae home to the kingdom of mythical Agamemnon.

DAY FIVE: ATHENS / HYDRA / POROS AEGINA

Full-day sightseeing includes a 3-island cruise to Hydra, Poros and Aegina. Leave Athens in the morning by coach to Trocadero Harbor. Sail for the island of Aegina. Cruise through the straits to Poros (visit). Then on to Hydra for time at leisure for shopping or swimming. Sail back to Trocadero Harbor and transfer by coach to Athens. Buffet lunch is served on the boat, and you'll enjoy entertainment and Greek Dancing while at sea

DAY SIX: ATHENS

Today visit the New Acropolis Museum. A walk through the New Museum's galleries is a walk through history – between the masterpieces of the Archaic and Classical periods, but also in the ancient neighborhoods of Athens. The museum has over 14,000 square meters of exhibition spaces
