

The Republic of Ireland consists of over 80% of the "Emerald Isle". This lush green island is full of thatched cottages, pubs, music, wit and poetry. The relaxed good humor of the people make Ireland a most welcoming place to visit and perform.

Ireland has seen more than its share of wars and disasters, culminating in the Great Famine of 1845-8. Since then, emigration has been part of the Irish way of life. In fact, more people of Irish descent live in the United States than in Ireland itself! This is certainly one reason that so many American groups are interested in visiting this country.

This is the homeland of literary giants such as James Joyce, George Bernard Shaw, Samuel Beckett, Jonathan Swift and Oscar Wilde. Music-wise, who has not heard the unmistakable lilt of an Irish tenor?

Treland is the only country in the world to have a musical instrument – the harp – as its national emblem. In this land, famous for its love of music, modern forms such as country & western and rock flourish, but it is the traditional music that captures the essence of the country.

he American Celebration of ■ Music is a special annual performance-tour program, co-sponsored by local governments, music associations, community organizations, and tourist boards around the globe. In many countries this has developed into a prestigious, recognized, year-long concert-series festival. Recognition of this festival facilitates greater access to performance venues, official publicity, generally very successful concert arrangements, and the ability to touch local cultures in a way that may not be done through other affiliations. This equates to more meaningful musical and emotional experiences for participating performance ensembles.

Whether you are listening to Gaelic love songs that date back to medieval times or 17th – and 18th-century folk songs with their English and Scottish influences, the music is unmistakably Irish. And dance is an equally important aspect of Irish culture.

Come to the land of St. Patrick to see Neolithic sites, kiss the Blarney Stone, listen for banshees, look for leprechauns, hear Gaelic spoken, and most of all, perform in historic settings to warm, appreciative audiences.

Sample Tour

Killarney / Blarney / Waterford / Kilkenny / Glendalough / Dublin

Day One

• Depart via scheduled air service to Shannon or Dublin, Ireland

Day Two: Killarney

- Arrive in Shannon or Dublin
- Meet your MCI Tour Manager, who will assist the group to awaiting chartered motorcoach for a transfer to Killarney via Bunratty Castle, the most complete and authentic medieval fortress in Ireland. Built in 1425 it was restored in 1954 to its former medieval splendor. The Folk Park is a living reconstruction of the homes and environment of Ireland of over a century ago. Stroll from house to house or around the charming village street to experience village life in 19th century Ireland
- Continue to Killarney for late afternoon hotel check-in
- Evening Welcome Dinner and overnight

Day Three: Killarney

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Full-day excursion along the Ring of Kerry, a 179 km road circuit around the Iveragh Peninsula. It has captivating mountain and coastal scenery, dotted with slateroofed fishing villages. The Ring is one of Ireland's premier tourist attractions
- Lunch on own
- Performance as part of the American Celebration of Music in Ireland
- Evening dinner and overnight

Day Four: Killarney / Blarney / Waterford / Kilkenny

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Transfer to Blarney where we will visit the Blarney Castle and Stone. The castle
 dates from 1446 and is built on solid limestone in beautiful grounds. The sacred
 stone is found at the top of the castle and when you catch a glimpse of it, you may
 well feel compelled to bend over backwards and kiss it!
- Lunch on own
- Continue to Waterford for a walking tour of the city given by Jack Burtchaell. Jack Burtchaell has for years now charmed and informed visitors on his historic tours. Awalled city of Viking origins, Waterford retains much of its medieval character together with the graceful buildings from its 18th century expansion. Reginald's Tower marks the city's Viking heart and the surrounding area is particularly attractive. Also visit the Waterford Glass visitors center to see the famous hand cut crystal
- Then it is off to Kilkenny for dinner and overnight


Day Five: Kilkenny / Glendalough / Dublin

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Transfer to Glendalough and the Wicklow Mountains. The steep wooded slopes of Glendalough the "valley of the two lakes" harbor one of Ireland's most atmospheric monastic sites — established in the 6th century. Here we see the Round Tower, Cathedral, St. Kevin's Cross and Kitchen, and Gatehouse
- Lunch on own
- Continue to Dublin for dinner and overnight









Day Six: Dublin

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Enjoy a tour of Dublin including St. Stephen's Green, South Bank, College Green, Merrion Square, Liffey Footbridges, Grafton Street, Temple Bar, O'Connell Street, Phoenix Park, and entrance to Trinity College, Ireland's oldest university. Trinity College contains the Book of Kells, which dates from AD 800, making it one of the oldest books in the world. Also visit Dublin Castle
- Lunch on own
- Performance as part of the American Celebration of Music in Ireland
- Evening Farewell Dinner and overnight

Day Seven: Depart for home

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Transfer to Dublin's airport for return flight
