Day 1

Depart via scheduled air service to Munich, Germany

Day 2

Munich / Neuschwanstein / Innsbruck

(D)

Arrive in Munich

Meet your MCI Tour Manager, who will assist the group to the awaiting motorcoach

Transfer to Innsbruck, stopping enroute to visit Neuschwanstein Castle (made famous by the Walt Disney model in Anaheim), built by the infamous Ludwig II (including entrance and uphill transport)

Late afternoon hotel check-in

Welcome Dinner and overnight in Innsbruck

Innsbruck, venue of the 1964 and 1976 Winter Olympics, is one of the most beautiful towns of its size (100,000). This 800-year-old university city is bounded on the north by the shimmering wall of the Nordkette Range of the Alps, on the south by the Tuxer Range rising to heights of 10,000 feet. The Empress Maria Theresia loved the Tyrol and Innsbruck, like her ancestor Emperor Maximilian I which accounts for the city's many beautiful buildings

Day 3

A morning guided tour of Innsbruck includes the Golden Roof, St. James' Cathedral, Wilten Basilica, and the Hofkirche (Court Church) Lunch, on own

Performance as part of the American Celebration of Music in Austria Evening dinner and overnight

Day 4

Innsbruck / Salzburg

Breakfast at the hotel

Morning transfer to Salzburg. Take a panoramic *Sound of Music* city tour of Salzburg, including important movie sights such Mirabell Palace and Gardens, and the famed Gazebo located at Hellbrunn Palace

Lunch, on own

Enjoy an afternoon guided tour of Salzburg including Mirabell Palace and Gardens, Mozart Square, the Dom (cathedral), University Church, entrance to the Mozarthaus (Mozart's birthplace) and a cable car ride up to the Fortress (for an unparalleled view of the city below)

Evening dinner and overnight













Salzburg, Mozart's birthplace, is a delight from the first of the outline of the Hohensalzburg Fortress, the symbol of the power of the prince-archbishops. The city's picturesque streets with their wrought-iron signs, its spacious squares with sculptured fountains and the noble architecture of its buildings inspired by bishops with a passion for construction, leave memories which linger for years

Day 5 Salzburg / Hallein (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

Morning excursion to the Salt Mines in Hallein. The tour entails a walk through underground galleries, with a presentation in a cave showing the different techniques used in the extraction of salt and the descent on slides (toboggans)

Lunch, on own

For choirs only: Sing recital in Salzburg Dom

Afternoon at leisure

Performance as part of the American Celebration of Music in Austria

Evening dinner and overnight

Day 6 Salzburg / Graz (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

Transfer to Graz

Lunch, on own

An afternoon guided tour of Graz includes the Cathedral (Domkirche), Staircase Tower, Freedom Square, the Landhaus, Hauptplatz, the Medieval Quarter (named a UNESCO Cultural Heritage Site), and entrance to the famous Arsenal containing five stories of armor, weaponry, instruments of torture etc. from the Middle Ages

Performance as part of the American Celebration of Music in Austria Evening dinner and overnight

Graz, the capital of Styria, is a city of Old World charm and home of several jazz conservatories. It is Austria's second largest city and has served as a very important meeting point between East and West for centuries. Three world-famous universities ensure a vibrant cultural life in a city awarded honors in Europe for outstanding preservation of its medieval center. The medieval city center has been declared one of the finest medieval cities in Europe - it has undeniable charm, a pleasing synthesis of Germanic sobriety and Italian grace

Day 7 Graz / Eisenstadt / Vienna (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

Transfer to Vienna

Stop en route in Eisenstadt. Everything in Eisenstadt reminds one of the brilliant composer Haydn. Entrance is included to Esterhazy Palace with its Haydnsaal, where many of Haydn's works were premiered, and also to Haydn's House, which is now a museum

Lunch, on own

Continue to Vienna stopping at Vienna's Central Cemetery to visit the graves of Beethoven, Brahms, Schubert, Strauß, and to see the Mozart Memorial Evening dinner and overnight













Vienna is still considered the music capital of the world. It is a city of refined tastes, grace, style and unmatched artistic accomplishments. For a thousand years, Vienna was the capital of the far-flung Holy Roman and Hapsburg empires. Though its people and ways have changed, Vienna has retained its imperial monuments, not as reminders of past glories, but as living symbols of its present freedom

Day 8 Vienna (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

Half-day guided tour of *Historical Vienna* includes the Ringstráße, Imperial Palace, State Opera, Town Hall, Burgkapelle (home of the Vienna Boys Choir), Palace Stables, Strauß Monument, and entrance to Schönbrunn Palace, built by the Hapsburgs in imitation of Versailles

Lunch, on own

Performance as part of the American Celebration of Music in Austria Evening dinner and overnight

Day 9 Vienna (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

Half-day guided tour of *Musical Vienna* includes entrance to the Haus der Musik (House of Music), a modern interactive sound museum located in the historic city center. This tour also includes the Museum of the Vienna Philharmonic, which is part of the House of Music. The *Musical Vienna* tour concludes with a visit (entrance included) to the Beethoven Heligenstadt apartment

Lunch, on own

Afternoon at leisure for sightseeing, shopping and other activities Evening Farewell Dinner

Day 10 Depart for home (B)

Breakfast at the hotel

Transfer to Vienna's airport for return flight
