Morning visit to Segesta, which stands as a testament to the enduring legacy of ancient civilizations. Visit the Archeological park, a masterpiece of Greek architecture that seems to defy the passage of time. Set against a backdrop of serene rolling hills and olive groves, the temple's sturdy columns and weathered stone tell the story of a bygone era. Wandering through the archaeological park, visitors can discover remnants of ancient walls, streets, and structures that whisper stories of daily life in Segesta



Cefalù / Castel Tusa / Tindari / Taormina (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel, followed by check-out

Transfer to Taormina with various stops along the coast. Stop in Cefalù, one of the pearls of the coast with its wonderful Norman fortress and Duomo. Also visit Castel Tusa (a charming fisherman village), Capo D'Orlando (famous for its beach resort), and Tindari including a visit to the Greek Theatre. From there take the highway via Milazzo* and Messina

Day 5

Continue to Taormina

Enjoy an afternoon half day guided sightseeing tour of Taormina, a picturesque hilltop town on the East cost of Sicily. Enjoy a visit to the Teatro Antico di Taormina, an ancient Greco-Roman Theatre still used today. Near the theater, cliffs drop to the sea forming coves with sandy beaches. A narrow stretch of sand connects to Isola Bella, a tiny island and nature reserve

Nestled on the eastern coast of Sicily, Taormina is a picturesque town that effortlessly compounds ancient history, stunning landscapes, and a touch of modern sophistication. Perched on a hillside overlooking the Ionian Sea and framed by the majestic Mount Etna, Taormina is a destination that captivates with its timeless charm

Mount Etna / Taormina (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

Visit Mount Etna, an active stratovolcano near the city of Catania. Mount Etna is one of the tallest active Volcanoes in Europe. In Greek mythology, the deadly monster Typhon was trapped under this mountain by Zeus. The fertile volcanic soils support extensive agriculture, with vineyards and orchards spread across the lower slopes of the mountain and the broad Plain of Catania to the South (Supplemental Cost for 4x4 Jeep to highest point: \$100 per person)

Ortigia / Siracusa

Breakfast at the hotel, followed by check-out

Transfer to Siracusa. Enjoy a sightseeing visit to Ortigia, an island nestled in the heart of the Ionian Sea. Ortigia is a charming island that effortlessly transports visitors back in time. The narrow, labyrinthine streets are lined with centuries-old buildings. See the centerpiece of Ortigia, the Piazza del Duomo, a lively square surrounded by architectural wonders. The Cathedral of Syracuse is also a stunning example of Baroque architecture which dominates the square. Nearby, the Fountain of Arethusa adds a touch of mythological allure to the surroundings, as the freshwater spring is believed to be linked to Greek mythology. Ortigia's waterfront is a picturesque blend of colorful buildings, quaint cafes, and panoramic views of the crystal-clear sea
