# Breakfast at the hotel

Excursion to Trapani, nestled between the rolling hills of Sicily and the azure waters of the Tyrrhenian Sea. Enjoy a guided walking tour of the city. See the historic city center, with its narrow winding streets and pastel-colored buildings, it is a testament to Trapani's rich cultural heritage. Dominating the skyline is the Torre di Ligny, an ancient watchtower that once guarded the coast against invaders. Today, the tower houses a maritime museum. Trapani's spiritual heritage is also reflected in its churches, such as the Chiesa del Purgatorio and the Santuario dell'Annunziata

## Lunch, on own

Afternoon visit to Selinunte, located on the southwestern coast of Sicily. Selinunte is an archaeological treasure trove, renowned for its well-preserved Greek temples, expansive ruins, and a serene setting overlooking the Mediterranean Sea. Visit the archaeological park in the heart of Selinunte, where the remains of several Greek temples stand as silent witnesses to the city's former glory. See the Temple of Hera, also known as Temple E. Adjacent to Temple E is the Temple of Apollo, an architectural masterpiece that showcases the precision and artistry of ancient Greek builders. Finally, visit the Temple of Zeus, one of the largest Greek temples ever constructed. The acropolis of Selinunte overlooks the sea, providing a panoramic view of the Sicilian coastline Return to Palermo

## Cefalù / Tindari / Reggio Calabria (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel, followed by check-out

Transfer to Reggio Calabria with various stops along the coast. Stop in Cefalù, one of the pearls of the coast with its wonderful Norman fortress and Duomo. Also visit Castel Tusa (a charming fisherman village), Capo D'Orlando (famous for its beach resort), and Tindari including a visit to the Greek Theatre. From there take the highway via Milazzo\* and Messina Lunch, on own Transfer to the ferry to Reggio Calabria

## Day 7

# Reggio Calabria / Cosenza / Matera (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel, followed by check-out Enjoy a guided sightseeing tour of Reggio Calabria. Visit the Piazza Italia, the main square, a vibrant hub surrounded by elegant buildings and cafes. Also see the Lungomare Falcomatà, a seaside promenade that stretches along the Strait of Messina. Visitors are offered stunning panoramic views of the Sicilian coastline and the iconic silhouette of Mount Etna in the distance. Next, encounter the Torre di Ligny. This historic watchtower, perched on a rocky outcrop, provides a glimpse into Reggio Calabria's maritime defenses. Finally , head towards the Cathedral of Reggio Calabria, a place of spiritual significance with its Norman architecture and serene interior.













## Day 5

#### Lunch, on own

Transfer to Cosenza. Nestled between the Sila and Aspromonte mountain ranges, Cosenza boasts a stunning landscape characterized by rolling hills, lush greenery. The city is divided into two parts by the Crati River, with the old town (Cosenza Vecchia) perched on a hill overlooking the modern city. The modern part of Cosenza features a blend of contemporary amenities and historic elements. Corso Mazzini, the main thoroughfare, is lined with shops, cafes, and elegant buildings, making it a lively hub for locals and visitors. The Rendano Theatre, an architectural gem, hosts various cultural events and performances Continue to Matera

Matera, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the world, is a captivating marvel of ancient architecture and cultural significance. Nestled in the rugged region of Basilicata in southern Italy, Matera is renowned for its unique cave dwellings, carved into limestone cliffs, creating a mesmerizing landscape that transports visitors to a bygone era

	Romanesque-style church. The cathedral, dedicated to the Virgin Mary under		
	the title of the Madonna della Bruna, showcases intricate architecture
